President's Corner

Well, it's sure has been busy since the start of 2015! Most of you know by now that our two new Yaesu DR-1X System Fusion Repeaters have been installed and are performing well. Both repeaters were delivered to Furman's house about three weeks ahead of when promised by Yaesu – a pleasant surprise indeed. After "fooling around" with them for a short time, to get comfortable with proper configuration, Furman (and sorry, not sure who else was there at the Red Cross) installed the first system on 146.85 without a hitch. The DR-1x seemed to be working well, and those with the System Fusion radios began to get familiar with the new mode. Grant (N8ICS) brought his FTM400 mobile into the January club meeting and gave a short demo of the radio and its functions. The FTM is their mobile rig, and the nice color touchscreen was sure impressive. Terry (KF4KPM) and I believe Paul (N4CE) also had their FT1DR handy talkies, so we were able to witness the "group monitor" function in operation. Group monitor lets you see who is in your range at a given time, and you can set up groups as you'd like, such as ARES, RCARC, or whatever you would like. I think it was a week or two after 146.85 went up, Furman, Paul, Eddie, and myself all met in Madison to install the repeater at the 147.345 site, taking before/after readings. I was truly surprised just how easy it was to get the system online. Had we not been taking readings along the way, it would have been less than 30 minutes. I told my wife I would be gone for a few hours, so I wasn't sure what to do with all that free time! The System Fusion has many other capabilities, and I expect we will be learning more about them at upcoming meetings.

The club has finalized arrangements to hold our 2015 Swapfest at Community Baptist Church in Reidsville, a location that had been used in the past. While I had not been to the Swapfests at this location, I understand that the facility is very nice with ample indoor room for vendors who so chose, and plenty of tail gate space as well. Thanks to Jim, Jamey, Paul, and others who checked the facility out and drove this issue to completion. And thanks to Matt for quickly getting this up on the website so those who see our advertisement in the SERA Journal will have all the details.

Once again, ham fest season is upon us. Several members ventured up to Richmond, VA. For the FrostFest last weekend, and I am concerned to note that they have reported it was not up to its usual past. There were none of the larger manufacturers and retailers present, and George (WA4LTY) wasn't able to find anyone who would sell him an FTM400 mobile rig: Talk about disappointment – money in the pocket and no one to take it from you! Be sure to check out the announcements elsewhere in this newsletter and in the ham radio magazine of your choice for all the upcoming hamfests, and let the

members know if you plan to go. Perhaps a few carpools can be arranged for some social time along the way. A few of us will be heading up to Dayton in May on the bus trip organized annually by Bill Lundy (NC4BL, Mt. Airy, NC), and I hope to find a good deal on one while there. But I will mention for anyone considering a mobile System Fusion radio, Yaesu is offering a \$100 mail-in rebate through the end of March, and most retailers have it at \$599, so you can have one now for \$499 after the rebate. If my tax refund hits soon, I may not be able to contain myself until Dayton.

FCC Paperless Amateur Radio License Policy Goes into Effect on February 17, 2015

Starting February 17, the FCC no longer will routinely issue paper license documents to Amateur Radio applicants and licensees. The Commission has maintained for some time now that the official Amateur Radio license authorization is the electronic record that exists in its Universal Licensing System (ULS), although the FCC has continued to print and mail hard copy licenses.

Under the new procedures, licensees will access their current official authorization (Active status only) via the ULS License Manager. The FCC will continue to provide paper license documents to all licensees who notify the Commission that they prefer to receive one. Licensees also will be able to print out an official authorization as well as an unofficial reference copy from the ULS License Manager.

Under the new procedures, a new license applicant who already has an FCC Registration Number (FRN) and provides a valid e-mail address under Applicant Information in the ULS will receive an official ULS - generated electronic authorization via e-mail. New license applicants lacking an FRN will receive in the mail an FRN and a temporary password to access the Commission Registration System (CORES).

New applicants will no longer automatically receive a license document and must request one by changing their "Paper Authorization Preference" in the ULS License Manager.

The ARRL and other Amateur Radio commenters also worried that unless a license document is printed on distinctive paper stock, its authenticity could be questioned in such situations as obtaining vanity call sign license plates. To address this, the FCC said the watermark Official Copy will be printed on each page of an official authorization that a licensee prints out from the ULS. The WTB recently stopped using distinctive paper stock to produce hard copy licenses and has been printing these on standard, white recycled paper.

Committee Reports:

ARES/Skywarn:
