President's Corner

Welcome to October! With our social in September, I feel a little bit disconnected and am looking forward to getting back to business this month as well as an informative program.

In late September, I was able to apply the latest firmware patch on the 147.345 repeater. The patch from Yaesu was released on July 15th, and its primary purpose was to facilitate the remote shutdown of the TX function by tone control. After following the instructions to flash the firmware, the display did not seem to be responding as the instruction document indicated, and I finally had to call Yaesu Tech Support. Quickly, we both realized that I had not been toggling the appropriate switch on the circuit board which allows firmware writing, and once I understood where to do this, all went perfectly according to the instruction sheet. Yes, I'm a guy, but I have to admit that sometimes actually reading instructions versus "skimming" can be of help! To be clear for all, this is NOT the long-awaited patch that permits C4FM digital voice to be passed through the Wires-X internet connection system: We are still waiting for Yaesu to come out with that.

The same day as that the firmware was upgraded, we were able to get a DSL internet connection set up at the site as well. I am happy to say that the speed is pretty decent, and the connection seemed very stable. At home I continue to fool around with the Wires-X interface that I purchased for the machine, and so far things are progressing, but I do need to put some more time into it to get proficient. I am hoping to be sufficiently up the learning curve that I can have it installed on the repeater before the club meeting in October.

Many of you replied to my email offering your support for the internet access for 147.345, and I thank you for that. I currently have 10 months of services covered, but we still have two more months that present an opportunity for someone to help share in the cost of adding internet service. If you would like to help, please email me directly at <u>bswag@yahoo.com</u>, and I thank you for your help.

As I mentioned in last month's newsletter, the next couple of meetings are critically important for the long term health of RCARC as we begin to make plans for next year and hold elections for club officers.

PHISHING

If you use an arrl.netemail alias and the ARRL email forwardingservice, be on the lookout for a phishing scam. A number of ARRL members have reported to the League that they received an email from "Arrl Webmail Admin" with "account upgrade" in the subject line. The email requests such personal information as user names and passwords, and includes a bogus message telling the recipient that the accounts are being removed and upgraded to an enhanced service. The ARRL emphatically states this is not an official message and is caution ingrecipients of these emails.

Andy Shefrin, KB1YHB, the ARRL's IT Infrastructure and Operations Manager, says: QUOTE "The ARRL is aware of this phishing scheme and is working to block the sender's email address at our upstream provider. As with any emails of unknown origin, do not open or reply." ENDQUOTE

In short, ignore it. If you do develop problem with e-mail forwarding, contact the ARRLIT Department. And be careful out there.

WEBSITE WOES

In the latest in a series of online security issues affecting hams around the world, the Radio Society of Great Britain reports a breach that has affected users' passwords on the website for RSGB's Islands on the Air. A bug in the online code was apparently exploited, allowing the intruder to reset the passwords of all the website's users, which prevented anyone from logging in.

Immediately following the Sept. 27 breach, IOTA issued a statement of reassurance saying, QUOTE "There is no sign in the system logs that any data was read or that personal data was compromised". The website has been encouraging users to change their passwords and to contact them directly with any additional concerns.

HAMVENTION INTERVENTION

A published report in Dayton, Ohio, has cast doubts on the location of next year's Dayton Hamvention. An Oct. 2 report published in the Dayton Daily News notes that this global gathering of more than 25,000 amateurs, which infuses the local economy with \$8.5-million each year, may face relocation from Hara Arena. Hamvention has been held there since 1964. It is no secret that the arena has been beset with financial challenges in recent years.

Emails obtained recently by the newspaper raise questions about the arena's future, and describe how city and tourism officials are scrambling to compile alternative sites to keep Hamvention in the Dayton region. An Aug. 26 email from Dayton Convention Manager Michael Cashman to one Dayton official described the prospect of holding Hamvention 2016 at Hara as "highly unlikely". Cashman's message reported that the Dayton Amateur Radio Association had already been given tours of such alternate venues as the Dayton Convention Center and the Dayton Airport Expo Center.

But Jim Tiderman, N8IDS, general chairman of the Dayton Amateur Radio Association, has been downplaying the somber prospect of relocation. Tiderman says the board does not foresee any relocation unless "something catastrophic" happens. And the Dayton/Montgomery County Convention & Visitors Bureau agreed this is not the first year that alternative sites have been put on the table for Hamvention.

Meanwhile, it's business as usual, as planning sessions continue for Hamvention 2016. The Dayton gathering is set to run May 20 through the 22nd. From DAYTON DAILY NEWS, ARRL

ROME ON THE RADIO

Barely two weeks after Pope Francis' historic visit to the United States, the Vatican is making news again in the amateur radio world. On the weekend of Friday, Oct. 10 and Saturday, Oct. 11, Rome will host a DX Summit and Vatican City's station, HV0A will be active on several bands. The summit will feature a presentation on easing traffic during a DXpedition, and other ways to improve the DX experience. According to Finland's Martti Laine, OH2BH, the summit agenda also includes plans to unveil a new Q code. Laine helped organize the event with Italy's Giordano Giordani, IK0XFD and Francesco Valsecchi, I-K-ZERO-F-V-C (IK0FVC). If you work the Vatican, send QSL cards to Valsecchi, IK0FVC, and Logbook of the World. The summit will also feature a paper from DX University given the working title, "How to Work Everything with No Pain — Even Europe." *– From ARRL*
