PRESIDENT'S CORNER

Greetings;

Please plan to join the club for 2021 Field Day activities on June 26 & 27 at Jim's "barn", 660 Butter Road near Wentworth. Most of us will congregate at Jim's "barn" about 8 AM to erect antennas and set-up/test equipment so come join the fun. Field Day officially commences at 2 PM on Saturday. There will be CW, phone and digital stations (with control operators) available for use during the exercise so everyone can participate. The club will provide a 6 PM evening meal for everyone on-site at 5 PM Saturday; being your own beverage and chair.

Jim, N3UZ, has scheduled a, "last minute", VE test session for that same Saturday. Registration begins at 9 AM. This may be your final chance to test for a new license or upgrade without being tagged with a \$35 FCC application fee! Details on the VE testing are available on our website (www.n4iv.org).

The club will conduct a brief called business meeting on June 26th at the Field Day site. Eligible voting members present will vote on a motion by the technical committee to purchase some equipment necessary to facilitate moving the 146.85 repeater to the 440 MHz band with the goals of 1) avoiding the paging transmitter interference on the current repeater frequency and 2) fostering more active use of the 70 cm band. This called meeting is scheduled occur during the evening meal interval.

For those new to the club (and a reminder for the rest of us); the RCARC has been granted a location for the 147.345 repeater (building space, AC power, tower, transmission line, antenna, etc.) in exchange for the club's commitment to keep the lawn around the site mowed and manicured during the summer months. Thanks to Jim (N3UZ) and Bob (KN4BBA) for fulfilling our obligation during a HOT afternoon last month. I'm sure they can use your help as well as your appreciation for their efforts. BTW, Mike (WA3RFE), Roger (W4AYO), Bill (N8KSG), Paul (N4CE) and Jim (KH4NBH) have likewise "paid for use of the repeater site" recently. Their toil has made possible the continued

availability of this repeater site for all of us!

FCC MAY CONSIDER NEW LOW-POWER FM LICENSES

PAUL/ANCHOR: Make room on the bands - maybe - for some new low-power FM stations. The US Federal Communications Commission is considering rule changes that would pave the way for approval of new low-power FM licenses. Acting Chairwoman Jessica Rosenworcel said the matter is on the agenda at the commission's June 17th meeting. The move follows actions the commission took last year to modify engineering rules for low-power FM stations.

KICKER: RADIO'S BLASTS, NOT NECESSARILY FROM THE PAST

PAUL/ANCHOR: Finally, we ask: Do you love solving a good mystery? Scientists think they may be getting ready to do just that. They're hot on the trail of some mysterious—and intensely fast—radio signals. Here's Neil Rapp WB9VPG with the details.

NEIL: Fast radio bursts: No, that's not the enviable signal report you dream of getting from that rare DX somewhere in the Antarctic. These are the formerly mysterious deep space signals astronomers have been tracking using NASA's Hubble Space Telescope. Notice we said "formerly" mysterious. For years scientists have scratched their heads over the source of these 1,000 or so powerful blasts, which began

showing up in 2001. They are, however, so fast that they're here and then....they're not. According to a report in CBS News, scientists have traced only 15 of them and they apparently came from distant galaxies. New findings about to be published in The Astrophysical Journal, track five of the most recent radio blasts to the so-called "spiral arms" of the galaxies, the places where stars form - but not from 'young stars exploding and dying. Rather, the blasts' origins appear to be from neutron stars, young magnetars that have powerful magnetic fields. While this doesn't completely solve the mystery, it does narrow things down quite a bit and that's no small task. This is the kind of power we hams can only envy: in the one-thousandth of a second it takes these flares to erupt, they create as much energy as the sun does in a year.
